Subject: School Operating Budget: 2013-14

Summary/Description:

On January 22, 2013, the school administration presented the proposed 2013-14 school operating budget to the school board. The budget, which includes a 2.5 percent increase in compensation for all employees; additional staff in the areas of special education, gifted/enrichment, counseling, security and truancy, custodial services and technology; various software applications; and instructional materials and programs, requires an additional \$2,626,257 in funding.

The school administration was asked to forward its proposed 2013-14budget request to the city manager by the end of January for planning purposes. The official adoption of the 2013-14 school operating budget will not occur until after the school board conducts its public budget hearing in March and the Virginia General Assembly has passed its budget.
