Subject: Request for Textbook Reserve Funds

Summary/Description:

At the May 6, 2014, meeting, the school received information regarding the use of textbook reserve funds to support the first year of the LCS-One Initiative and the use of Chromebooks in secondary math and foreign language classrooms. Tonight's presentation will provide the school board with more detail about the funding and implementation of LCS-One. Mr. David Childress will present details regarding the funding of LCS-One and training and support for teachers.

The second portion of the presentation will outline a long-range plan for the use of textbook reserve funds. Included will be two brief presentations from teachers of how the Chromebooks can positively enhance instruction in math and foreign language classrooms.
