Subject: Lynchburg City Schools' Educational Technology Plan: 2013 - 2015

Summary/Description:

The Educational Technology Plan for Virginia: 2010-2015 is the Department of Education's most recently released vision for the use of technology in public schools. It serves as a blueprint for school divisions by identifying the necessary components of an effective technology program. In accordance with the No Child Left Behind Act, the universal services Act (E-Rate), and the Code of Virginia, school divisions must submit a local technology plan that is aligned with the state plan. The local plan must guide the division's use of educational technology for three to six years. The current Lynchburg City Schools' Educational Technology Plan outlines goals and objectives for years 2010-2012. The Technology Leadership Team, along with other stakeholders, has updated the current plan to align with the revised state plan until it expires on June 30, 2015. This timetable, if permitted, will also bring our local plan into the same renewal cycle as the Virginia Department of Education Technology Plan. Subject: Lynchburg City School Board Policies and Administrative Regulations Conversion Process

Summary/Description:

The school administration is beginning the process of converting the Lynchburg City Schools Board Policies and Administrative Regulations to the Virginia School Boards Association's policies. As a member of the VSBA Policy Services, the school division receives regular updates to policies which coincide with changes to the Code of Virginia. Further, all policies developed by the VSBA are reviewed by legal counsel.

The first section in the conversion process is school board bylaws. Revisions and substitutions to the bylaws have been reviewed by the city attorney's office to ensure that they are legally sound.

During the school board meeting on May 21, 2013, the school administration reviewed the conversion process with members of the school board. Since that time, school board members have had the opportunity to review the bylaws. The school administration will provide additional information as necessary during this presentation.

Subject: Local Consolidated Application: 2013-14

Summary/Description:

Both the United States Department of Education (USED) and the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) encourage local school divisions to submit consolidated applications for funding for programs authorized under the *Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA)*. The consolidated application allows greater cross-program planning and coordination to improve teaching and learning. The consolidated application also allows school divisions to complete one comprehensive needs assessment and to establish division-level goals and objectives supported by all programs. In addition to the comprehensive needs assessments, the consolidated application is based on needs assessments completed for individual schools, and it contains detailed measurable objectives and benchmarks, specific individual program services and activities, a staff and budget breakdown, and other information specific to individual programs.

The Lynchburg City Schools' Consolidated Application for 2013-2014, includes the budgets for Title I Parts A and D, Title II Part A, and Title III English as a Second Language. The school administration anticipates a ten percent reduction in Title I Part A funds and a five percent reduction to Title I Part D, and Title II Part A, and Title III. These cuts are anticipated due to the impact of Sequestration; however, all of these funding levels could be changed when final allocations are determined later this fall.

Title I Part A allocates funds for teachers, instructional assistants, supplemental instructional supplies, and parental involvement. Because there are Title I schools in the school division that have been identified for interventions according to the flexibility waivers granted by the USED, a portion of the funds have been set-aside to support improvement efforts in focus schools. Title I Part D provides funding to support the Truancy and Transition Programs. Title II Part A funds support class size reduction and professional development, including partial funding for the new coaching positions. Title III Part A funds support English Language Learners (ELL) programs.

School board approval is necessary prior to submitting the Local Consolidated Application for the 2013-2014 academic year to the Virginia Department of Education.

Subject: School Improvement Plans

Summary/Description:

Due to the accreditation status of Paul Laurence Dunbar Middle School for Innovation, Sandusky Middle School, and Heritage Elementary School as "Accredited with Warning," the Standards of Accreditation require that the school board approve each school's School Improvement Plan.

The Virginia Department of Education completed an academic review at Dunbar on January 24-25, 2013. Since the review, the staff at Dunbar has met all the requirements associated with the review and has modified the school's plan accordingly. Members of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction conducted an independent academic review at Sandusky Middle in fall 2011. Likewise, members of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction conducted an independent academic review at Heritage Elementary School in fall 2010. After reviewing the reports, the Virginia Department of Education confirmed that the internal reviews satisfied the state requirements for academic reviews.

The final step of this state-required process is the school board's approval of each school's plan. Schools must submit their board-approved plans to the state department via the Indistar Dashboard on or before June 28, 2013.

Sandusky Middle School presented its plan to the school board on March 5, 2013; Heritage Elementary School submitted its plan on October 2, 2012; and Dunbar presented its plan on May 21, 2013. In each case, the school board received a copy of the school's improvement plan, and members of the school's team shared strategies around key indicators.
