Summary/Description:

Mrs. Magdalena Markovinovic, German teacher at E. C. Glass High School, was recently recognized by the United States Department of State for her continuous work in establishing, promoting, and maintaining international relations between the students of Lynchburg, Virginia, and Stahnsdorf, Germany. Ms. Markovinovic initiated the German-American Partnership Program (GAPP) during the 2013-14 school year at Heritage High School. She transferred to E. C. Glass High School in fall 2015 where she expanded the program.

GAPP is a highly regarded academic exchange program supported by the German Foreign Office as well as the US State Department. The program promotes in-depth language learning and intercultural communication. Mrs. Markovinovic will be recognized by the school board during this presentation.

Subject: Virginia Graduation Measures

Summary/Description:

On September 26, 2017, the Virginia Department of Education released cohort graduation and dropout rates. Virginia has three graduation measures.

- The Virginia Graduation and Completion Index (GCI) is a Board of Education approved formula that calculates a weighted percent of the students within a given cohort who graduate, complete, or stay in school each year. It also incorporates outcomes for students who remain in school beyond their "on-time" graduation year. (Diploma 100, GED 75, still enrolled 70, Certificate of Program Completion 25).
- The Federal Graduation Indicator (FGI) recognizes graduates who earn Advanced and Standard Diplomas within four years of entering the ninth grade for the first time.
- Virginia On-time Graduation Rate (OGR) is a measure of graduates who earn Advanced Studies, Standard, and Applied Studies Diplomas within four years of entering the ninth grade for the first time.

During this presentation, the school administration will share the results of these graduation measures for each high school.
