The Lynchburg City School Board met for its regular meeting at 5:34 p.m. in the Board Room at the School Administration Building. Mrs. Barker opened the meeting and requested that those in attendance stand and recite *The Pledge of Allegiance*.

B. Study Session

The school administration reviewed the rationale for the proposed options of closing Perrymont Elementary School and Hutcherson Early Learning Center which includes maximizing funding provided through the Standards of Quality, providing all schools access to Title I funding, reduction of operational costs and more efficient utilization of facilities and staff.

Currently, the school division has five schools with a student enrollment of less than 300. By increasing the enrollment at those schools, the school division would realize additional funding of about \$50,000 per school; however, additional funding would not be realized for the 2010-11 school year as the funding would be based upon enrollment that existed on September 30, 2008.

Previously the school administration had presented \$875,000 in projected savings associated with the closing of Perrymont Elementary School. However, after calculating staffing for elementary schools, the savings would be closer to \$655,000 as there would be approximately \$220,000 savings due to the elimination of five teaching positions. The savings associated with closing Hutcherson Early Learning Center and relocating it at Perrymont Elementary School would be approximately \$100,000 in operational costs. Total savings for the closing of Perrymont Elementary School, relocating Hutcherson Early Learning Center to Perrymont, adjusting attendance zones so that all schools have an enrollment greater than 300, and making all schools Title I is projected to be \$983,000.

Following discussion of the superintendent's working papers, the school board received updated information regarding state funding. At this time, the House's proposed budget calls for permanent changes to the education funding formulas which include the elimination of state funding for the secondary planning period from the Standards of Quality and block-granting and reducing funding for a number of stand-alone incentive programs and at-risk and preschool programs. Many of the Senate's proposed budget reductions contain language which calls for temporary reductions that will not cause permanent changes to the funding formula. Both Senate and House budget proposals rely on VRS rate reductions to mitigate cuts in funding. However, the VRS rate reduction will result in larger payments becoming due in future years.

Total additions to the school operating budget are \$1,715,000 and are as follows:

- proposed increase in health/dental/vision insurance rates is \$500,000
- costs for second year of ERIP is \$875,000
- costs for new initiatives for algebra and on-line software \$340,000

Total reductions in operating revenue in the House's budget amount to \$12,606,006 and the Senate's budget amount to \$10,644,546.

The school administration reviewed the results received thus far from the calendar survey with the majority of respondents favor the 172-day calendar.
