C-1. Teacher of the Year: 2010-11

The goal of the Virginia Teacher of the Year program is to recognize dedicated, knowledgeable, and skilled teachers at the local, regional, and state level. To select the Lynchburg City Schools' Teacher of the Year, the school division used a nomination process whereby school staffs, principals, or school division administrators nominated teachers for this honor. A team composed of a parent, a school board member, a past Teacher of the Year recipient and central office staff then interviewed the nominated teachers.

The team gave special consideration for the following characteristics: experience in the school division and in the field of teaching, professional development activities, classroom performances, membership in professional organizations, and community involvement.

Dr. Merle P. Herndon, director of professional development and school business partnerships, introduced Ms. Janice Wiley, a teacher at Hutcherson Early Learning Center, as the Lynchburg City Schools' Teacher of the Year for the 2010-11 school year. Ms. Wiley was described as a person who always has kind words for others, embraces families, and is respected by advocates through the state. She lives to teach and touch the lives of others. Ms. Wiley thanked everyone for the opportunity to represent the school division as the teacher of the year.

C-2. Lynchburg City Schools' Education Foundation, Inc.

In March 2010, Mrs. Jodi K. Gillette assumed the role as director of the Lynchburg City Schools' Education Foundation, Inc. Mrs. Gillette stated provided a brief summary of the activities sponsored by the Education Foundation for 2009-10 which include the Breakfast with the Superintendent on March 11, 2010, the awarding

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of 38 grants to teachers on June 3, 2010, and the Sixth Annual Senior Honors Banquet on June 2, 2010. G-1. Budget Adjustment: Virginia Incentive Program for Speech-Language Pathologists (VIP-SLP)

Lynchburg City Schools receives flow-through funds from the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) for Special Education Federal Program Part B for Virginia Incentive Program for Speech-Language Pathologists (VIP-SLP).

The Virginia Department of Education notified the Lynchburg City Schools of the grant award in the amount of \$3,000.

This amount was not included in the 2009-10 operating budget and results in an increase to the Lynchburg City Schools operating fund budget of \$3,000.

G-2. Special Education Annual Plan/Part B Flow-through Application and Section 619 Preschool Grant Applications 2010-11

The Special Education Annual Plan is a formal agreement between the local school board and the Virginia Board of Education for the implementation of state and federal laws and regulations related to services mandated for students with disabilities. Accordingly, the disbursement of funds to the school division is contingent upon school board approval of the plan. The Virginia Department of Education has advised school divisions to anticipate level funding for the Flow-through and 619 Preschool grants.

Therefore, Lynchburg City Schools will apply for \$2,166,383 in special education Flow-through funds for the 2010-11 school year. The application for funds for the 2010-11 school year must be approved by the school board and submitted to the Virginia Department of Education for plan approval and financial reimbursement. Funds provide salaries and staff development activities focused on addressing the unique needs of students with disabilities, and \$16,000 will be used to provide autism spectrum disorder consultations for teachers.

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The Lynchburg City Schools will also apply for \$62,153 in Section 619 Preschool funds for the 2010-11 school year. This funding will be used to support the Hutcherson Early Learning Program as it provides special education and related services to preschool children (ages 2-5) who have been determined eligible for special education services. Funds provide adaptive equipment, computers, diagnostic services, inclusion support, salaries, instructional materials, teacher stipends, and child-find activities.

G-6. Administrative Regulation 6-58: Secondary Student Evaluation and Grading Procedures

On March 23, 2010, the school board approved the Lynchburg City Schools academic calendar for 2010-11. The approved academic calendar includes the following changes:

- 1) the replacement of the optional first-period with a seven-period high school day
- 2) the removal of the current high school exam structure
- 3) the addition of study halls and repeat courses in high school
- 4) the addition of a senior early dismissal option
- 5) the addition of elementary early dismissal days at the end of each six-weeks
- 6) the removal of seven work and professional development days

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- 7) the lengthening of the winter break
- 8) a spring break the week prior to Easter
- 9) an earlier last day of instruction, May 27, 2011
- 10) graduation on the afternoon on Sunday, May 29, 2011

Given the removal of the current high school exam structure (item two), the school administration recommends changes to Administrative Regulation 6-58: Secondary Student Evaluation and Grading Procedures.

H. Superintendent's Comments

Dr. McKendrick announced that E. C. Glass High School will host the All State Chorus event in April 2011.

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The school administration will meet with the PTO at Perrymont Elementary School to discuss the process associated with moving Hutcherson Early Learning Center to Perrymont Elementary School. Part of that process will include the naming of the center to include the name Carl B. Hutcherson, who was the first African American school board member. Once a name has been determined for the center, the school administration will bring that information to the school board for consideration.

The Blue Ridge Area Food Bank is starting a backpack program. This program allows students who are on free/reduced lunch to have the opportunity to take a backpack of food home on Friday and return the backpack to school on Monday to be filled and taken home the next Friday. This program will help ensure that students will have food over the weekend.

I. Board Comments

Rev. Anderson announced that the school board's Finance Committee met on April 22, 2010. During the meeting, members discussed the preliminary audit work of Brown, Edwards & Company, possible fund balance appropriations, and the unofficial ADM for March, which is 8,245. The 2009-10 budget was based on a projected student enrollment of 8,130, so the school division should realize additional funding. The next Finance Committee meeting will occur on June 3, 2010, at noon at the School Administration Building. A representative from Brown Edwards & Company will attend that meeting and provide the Committee with an update regarding the audit process.

Mr. Billingsly, who is chairman of the Governor's School Board, attended the awards ceremony at the school on May 3, 2010. He noted that the combined scholarships awarded to seniors is in excess of \$5 million.

Dr. Dolan-Sewell commented on the FIRST Junior Leggo League competition held at Thomas C. Miller Elementary School for Innovation. She noted that there was an extraordinary turnout of teams consisting of second and third grade students.

Mr. Webb provided information about the events and activities in which participated during the past two weeks. Of note were the Volunteer Breakfast hosted by staff at Perrymont Elementary School, the tour of the new Sandusky Middle School building, and Parent Academy held at E. C. glass High School.

Dr. Gerdes announced that he would not be seeking reappointment to the school board; however, he has enjoyed the time he has served and hopes that he was able to contribute to the school board in a meaningful way.
