

SCHOOL BOARD BYLAWS

Formulation and Approval of Regulations P 1-33A. Formulation

The Lynchburg City School Board shall delegate to the superintendent the function of specifying required actions and designing the detailed arrangements under which the schools of this division will be operated.

Such rules and detailed arrangements shall constitute the administrative regulations governing the schools. They must be in every respect consistent with the policies adopted by the school board.

In the absence of applicable school board policy, the superintendent is authorized to establish needed administrative regulations subject to later confirmation in school board policy, should the school board so wish.

The school board shall formulate and approve administrative regulations only when specific state laws require school board adoption, and may do so when the superintendent recommends school board adoption in light of strong community attitudes or probable staff reaction.

B. Approval

The school board does not approve administrative regulations unless specifically required to do so by law, or unless requested to do so by the superintendent.

The school board reserves the right to review and veto administrative regulations should they, in the school board's judgment, be inconsistent with the school board policies adopted by the school board.
